A strong emphasis on academic, social and emotional support, provision of wellbeing support and supported transition to an appropriate pathway



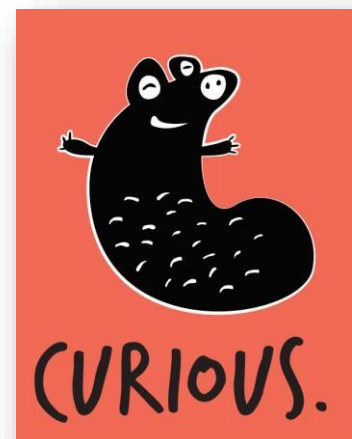
Small class groups managed by experienced and committed teachers and support staff
